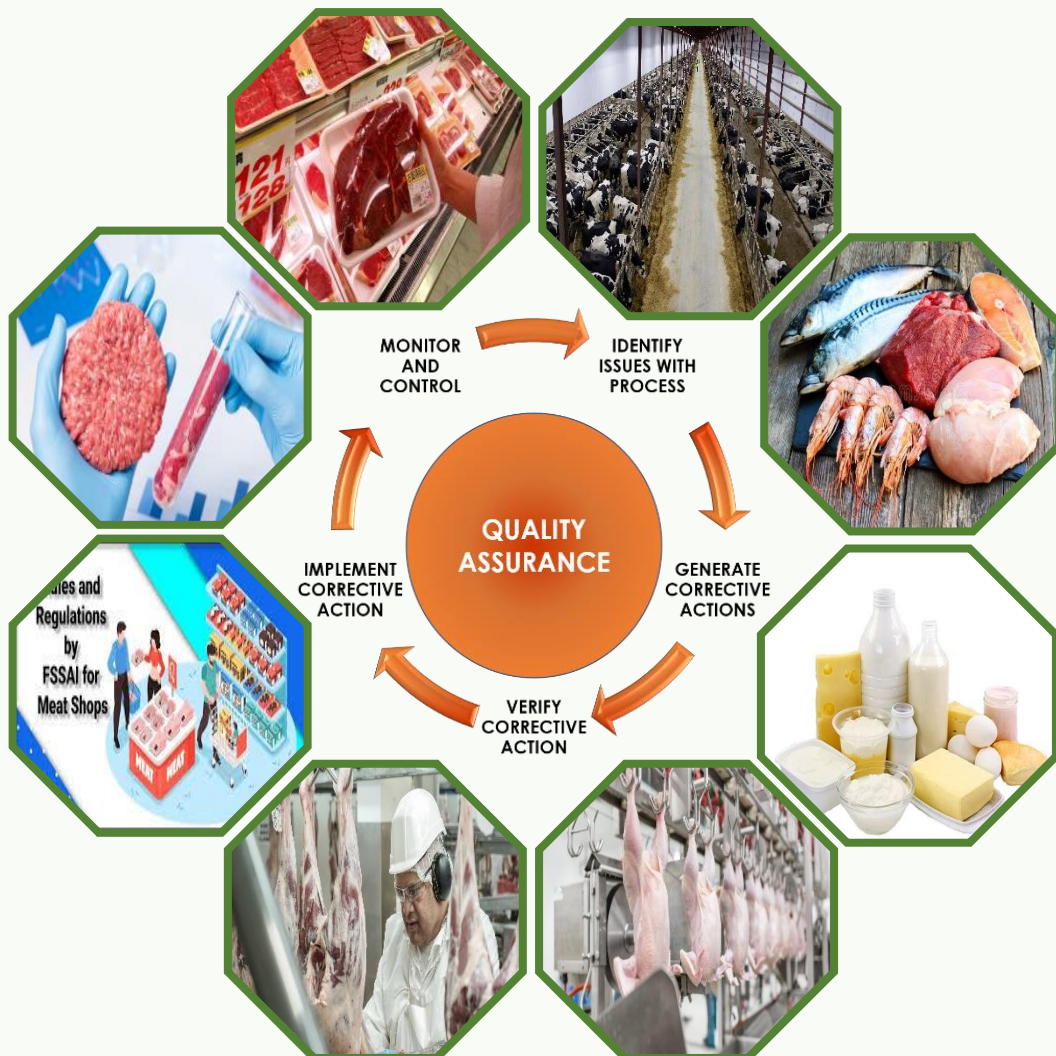

About the Training

The animal origin foods have been one of the cheapest sources of nutrition for the human population. There has been a significant shift in the consumption of animal origin food products due to urbanisation, people's purchasing power, and changed demographic patterns. People are opting for high-quality foods and are willing to pay a higher price for them. However, the quality assurance is a major challenge in the production of animal origin food.

Unsafe food containing harmful bacteria, viruses, parasites or chemical substances, causes more than 200 diseases. Diarrhoeal diseases are the most common illnesses resulting from the consumption of contaminated food, causing 550 million people to fall ill and 2,30,000 deaths every year. According to the World Health Organization, every year about 600 million – almost 1 in 10 people in the world – fall ill after eating contaminated food; and more than 4,00,000 die every year because of food borne diseases.

Food nutrition and food security are inter-linked and consumption of unsafe food creates a vicious cycle of disease and malnutrition, particularly affecting infants, young children, elderly and the sick people. Food borne diseases obstruct the social development, affect the economies, tourism and trade. The stakeholders are unaware of the recent advancements in the meat and milk sector which can form the profound base for the quality assurance of meat, milk and their products as well as for a successful business. Therefore, this training is planned to share recent information on the different aspects related on quality assurance and to make the personnel aware about hygienic and safe production of animal origin foods.

2. To discuss about practices/recent advances for production of hygienic and quality food.
